

## Flip Seat Belt Cover

Complaint – A child's legs/feet were injured sitting in the seat behind the flip seat

Cause – The cover which screws in place (Figure #1) and is designed to cover the seat belt mounting bolts and to keep the belts from falling on the floor has become bent from when it was initially installed causing some exposed sharp edges. See Figure#1 & #2

Correction – There are 2 fixes that can be done –

#1 – The cover can be removed and the screws which secured it reinstalled in the seat frame – Figures #2 & #3

#2 – The cover can be removed, straightened and "edge guard" installed along the lower edge to cover the sharp edges – Figures #4 & #5
