

Buzzer with a "MIL" or ENGINE WARN Light

Complaint – There is a light on the dash and buzzer that keeps going off and is annoying to the driver and students

Cause – Something has occurred to make the lights illuminated and buzzer go off. An ENGINE WARN light is an indication that there is something mechanically wrong with the operation of the engine and should come in for service soon. A MIL light is an indication that something with the emissions system is not functioning correctly and the vehicle should be looked at whenever the next time the shop can schedule it

Correction – The buzzer is added protection to ensure the driver acknowledges there is an issue so that it is repaired before engine damage occurs. The buzzer can be cancelled ("Acknowledged") by pressing and holding the lower button on the lower right corner of the dash for several seconds. (Figure #1)

The buzzer will remain "OFF" until an additional alarm occurs OR if the ignition is cycled on and off.


